Sexual health support for young people

Chlamydia Testing

Chlamydia - most common sexually transmitted disease in the UK.

It can present with no symptoms, and will be visible on testing two weeks after the last risk.

Emergency Contraception (EC)

EC is needed when there had been recent unprotected sex or when a contraception method had failed.

Emergency hormonal contraception - up to 120 hours after unprotected sex.

IUD (coil) up to 5 days after unprotected sex.

EHC - available free:

IUD - available free at some YorSexual health clinics.

STI advice, testing and Contraception

Free STI testing for chlamydia, gonorrhoea, syphilis and HIV.
Free contraception and advice including hormonal pills and long acting methods.

Testing and Contraception - all Yorsexual health clinics and GP surgeries.

Pregnancy Testing

If a young person believes they are pregnant a pregnancy test should be done as soon as possible.


A test can be done from the first day of a missed period or three weeks after last unprotected sex.

All professionals have a duty of confidentiality to young people including under 16s. In exceptional circumstances confidentiality may be broken - where the health, safety or welfare of the young person is at risk.

Compass REACH – Support all children and young people aged 9 to 19 (and up to 25 for those with special educational needs or disabilities) who are negatively affected by substance misuse, poor sexual health and issues relating to emotional wellbeing and mental health.
